Kanji â€“ The Structural Variations of Radicals

Radicals can occupy seven positions in a character. Each position has a name, as follows: Positions 1â€“2: When a kanji divides neatly into left and right sides, the left is ã¸,ã¸,“ (ã¸: side), and the right is ã¸ã¸ã¸ã¸,Š (æ—•: side). Out of the seven positions, Position 1 is the most common place to find a radical.

However, radicals like å†µ may be found in kanji like å†¶ (bad luck) and å†° (exit), but å†µ isn't a character, it's just a radical. While there seem to be arguments online about this, not every part of a character is a

radical either.

How to Find The Kanji Radical - Tofugu

In cases where the radical is the same as the kanji but the radical's name is different, you have to create a story, just like before, to connect the radical name and the kanji meaning. The only difference is you have to create a story from one radical.
